



Curbside Recycling in Miami Dade County

in the **Green Bin...**

- **Newspapers** and color inserts (no plastic delivery bags).
- **Flattened corrugated cardboard** (max 2 ft. x 3 ft.)
- **Household batteries**, first recycling day of each month - in a clear "zip-lock" baggie. **Phone books** Oct to Dec. (NO plastic bags!)



in the **Blue Bin...**

- **Aluminum and steel cans** (clean - **NO lids**.)
- **Clear, brown and green glass** (clean - **NO lids** - Labels are OK.)
- **Plastic containers** (**ONLY number "1", "2", or "3"**... Look for number on the bottom.)
- **Drink boxes, milk and juice cartons** : "gable-top" type cartons

Keep These Items **Out Of Your Recycling Bins:**

- Aluminum pie tins or foil
- Pizza and cereal boxes
- Tin can lids & bottle caps
- Bubble wrap & foam
- Plastic bags
- Window glass, ceramic glass, drinking glasses
- Aerosol spray cans
- Medicine and pesticide containers
